As much as I would like to clean up our work in the world—as much as I would like to make things pleasant and "safe" unfortunately Christians carry no inoculation against the hurt and harm around us either.

When I'm down about the workaday way we have to participate here in the nitty-gritty of life, I realize how much we need hope to come here, how desperately we need someone bigger than life. We need an extraterrestrial power to come here and change things--someone to care enough to get in here with us and show us that the hurt and harm and hate can be overcome.

Is there hope for another way?

Together, every year, Christians gather through Advent to reflect on our need for such a Presence. We look expectantly for that someone to come and "re-right" the world. As the Anglican Bishop N.T. Wright once said, we are waiting on the One who will turn the world "right-wise." This doesn't mean we don't have to ignore what's going on or pretend things are not as bad as they really are while we wait and participate. In fact, maybe it is most honest to forthrightly work with our hearts and hands holding forth this hope with intention: that all the earth awaits its Maker, and its Maker is on the way!

When we don't know what to pray this season; when we are stumped by the hurt or find ourselves at a loss for how to proceed in the coming days, I hope you find comfort in remembering the LORD is on the way. Our lack of words can simply be joined with nearly two millennia of Christian brothers and sisters who remind us to "Let All Mortal Flesh Keep Silence." The words of this amazing hymn have been comforting Jesus followers since the fourth century: Let all mortal flesh keep silence, and with fear and trembling stand; ponder nothing earthly-minded, for with blessing in his hand, Christ our God to earth descendeth, our full homage to demand.

King of kings, yet born of Mary, as of old on earth he stood, Lord of lords, in human vesture, in the body and the blood; he will give to all the faithful his own self for heavenly food.

Rank on rank the host of heaven spreads its vanguard on the way, as the Light of light descendeth from the realms of endless day, that the powers of hell may vanish as the darkness clears away.

At his feet the six-winged seraph, cherubim, with sleepless eye, veil their faces to the presence, as with ceaseless voice they cry: Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia, Lord Most High!

Now, *there* is some powerful hope for this present darkness!

In the Fall of 2015, some church members discussed the feasibility of utilizing some of the church property at the Promised Land for a cemetery. After Conference approval on August 23, 2015, a cemetery proposal was presented to the Tom's Creek Congregation. After many questions and much discussion, a vote was taken with the results of 52 in favor of the proposal and 22 against.

Those leading the discussion verified the fact that someone had volunteered to loan the finances necessary for this project. It was decided to make this available to the community and not just for church members; therefore, the name decided upon was Tom's Creek Community Cemetery.

The committee is strictly volunteers, and they are as follows: President - George Bruchey

Vice President - Tony Myers

Treasurer/Secretary & Salesperson -Jackie Troxell

Advisers - Randy & Kathy Amoss and Joe Coleman

Tony Myers and Randy Amoss are responsible for measuring the precise area where the excavations are to be made and memorials placed.

Special thanks to those who volunteered their services over the years to mow and keep the cemetery looking great. Joe Coleman, Jim Cramer, and most recently, Kathy Keys with Randy and Kathy Amoss substituting when necessary.

To date, 138 lots have been sold with a few hundred yet to sell in Section A.

As of November18, 2024, the loan has been **PAID IN FULL**.
